	• Discussion commenced about the role of the forum being a 'voice for the community'. (On the agenda).			
	Housing preference issues are important, so how to handle it.			
	Beth: Urban memory mapping and language education. Not only about Te Reo, but also other ethnic			
	groups and youth.			
	• Carole: With the rapid aging over the next 10 years, that's another language. SSF wishes to continue on			
	with housing preferences.			
	Beth: Need taxonomy – to have a working group.			
	 Jo queried whether the constraints work had been done and whether structure planning had started (fron 			
	previous minutes). Karen gave an overview of where things were at.			
	Peter apologised for the lateness of the paper included in the agenda. SSF needs to take a positive position			
	on this. Discussion was had about how important a topic it is and a work group will be formed.			
	 Jo queried whether Peter's background is to be incorporated into whole typologies? 			
	Mary: What about simple access to housing? Safe, warm, affordable housing. How is it going to be			
	provided? Engage with the government?			
	Peter: Spoke to Mayor Crosby re: Affordable Housing and Nick Smiths attitude (not interested).			
	Developers put covenants on which negate the 'affordable' housing.			
	Mary: Need the ability to create a big loud voice. Issues of poverty have not been tackled. Housing NZ has			
	no intention of building more houses.			
	SSF has a connection with HAF so must stand together.			
	Mary proposed that be at the next SGIC and will speak to it.			
	Jo: To create dialogue. SSF must lead and HAF to come in behind.			



		 Bay Trust about to launch concern at that level – low housing / homelessness. Karen advised where / what PATAG is looking at re: Bev James – Ageing Well. Smith's Farm: Jo said they did their thing.
9A4 – Giving Voice	Action Discussion	Peter to pull together a group to be there behind Carole / Mary (at next SGIC 16 th March). Pobossa gave an everyion of the working group and what's been happening. Have attracted a consertium.
Research Project Update (Rebecca Guilford)	Discussion	 Rebecca gave an overview of the working group and what's been happening. Have attracted a consortium who has worked hard over summer to come up with a detailed plan. Big cross-section of research areas – children, Maori, demographics, areas etc. Proposed date for end is June. Very isolated group at Waihi Beach, do not have a voice.

9A3 – Social Sector Inventory Project (SSIP)	Discussion	 Karen: Tripping along quite nicely. Socialink keen to do package. Kathy: Snapshot of research done of approximately 12 businesses. Carried out survey of organisations re: what type of research they were doing / interested in. Concluded that people don't really have a handle on what collaboration means. Perhaps need educating? Key Learnings: people don't understand potential of research in community. Jo: Is it timely to use the paper as a way of identifying or 'outreaching' in the social sector? (Discussion around this followed). Would UNO be a good vehicle for an article? Karen: Marketing of work under 9A3, possibly anything to go to the media be passed by SmartGrowth first.
Socialink	Discussion	 Carole wanted everyone to re-read Section 9. Funding – SSF to go to SGIC for art of the funding. (Discussed paper). Kathy led discussion. Karen explained the hoped for technical results. Values need to be included. Carole: Quote form document from last meeting – "Secure the horizons so they may become close". Building the Community: Carole would like everyone to re-read and be cognisant on how we're moving forward on this project. Rebecca: Health data needs to get the importance raised.
